Rather than giving in to the unchristian influences of our culture you are seeking to begin and establish your marriage in Christ who is our life and source of every blessing. I intend to do everything I can do to help you prepare for married life together.

As in anything we sinful humans do, we must always begin with repentance (Luke 13:3) and prayer (1<sup>st</sup> Thes. 5:16-18), in an honest look into our lives based upon the perfect and piercing word of God (Hebrews 4:12), and so we will. As repentance and forgiveness is the essential element of wedding preparation, it is also the essential element that must guide your lives together throughout your married life. As God tells us in His Word, "As the Lord has forgiven you, so you must also forgive." (Col. 3:13) May the Lord of the Church bless your marriage to be this sort of marriage.

It is my expectation that we will have 4-6 marriage counseling sessions as soon as possible at a time that is convenient for both of us, to ensure that various issues are discussed before the wedding. Defining Christian marriage, conflict resolution, the importance of forgiveness in marriage are some of the topics to be discussed. This will include some "homework" that will be done individually and together. Enclosed you will find:

- One *Wedding Questionnaire* (to be filled out together and brought to our next meeting)
- Two *Premarital Questionnaires* (to be filled out and mailed **individually**)
- One introductory *Premarital Bible Study* (to be done together and brought to our next meeting)
- One *Wedding Guide* (to be read thoroughly before our next meeting and then discussed)
- One letter *If You Are Living Together* (Only to be read **if** living together currently)

A note from Pastor Lingard if you are currently living together:

As in anything we sinful humans do, we must always begin with repentance (Luke 13:3) and prayer (1<sup>st</sup> Thes. 5:16-18), in an honest look into our sinful lives based upon the perfect and piercing word of God (Hebrews 4:12).

God has called you both to **“be holy, for I AM holy** (1 Peter 1:13-16).” He has called you to, **“present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God** (Romans 12:1).” God warns us to **“Flee from sexual immorality** (1 Cor. 6:18).” But God also warns us that if we do not change our ways we can only have **“a fearful expectation of judgment.** (Hebrews 10:27).” However, **“If we confess our sins, (God) is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness** (1 John 1:9).”

I want to encourage you to live out your baptismal vows and confirmation vows. In order to do this if you are currently living together and/or expecting a child you will be asked to acknowledge such action requires repentance on your part. Such acknowledgement will be promptly followed by forgiveness/absolution.

You will now have these two options...To marry immediately (within 2 weeks)and promise to abstain from any sexual intimacy and if desired to then later celebrate a marriage affirmation service, **OR** separate immediately until the wedding day and have separate mailing addresses. The aim is for you both to honor God publicly and privately by your words and deeds, in order to receive the Blessings of God for your holy marriage.

I have included a sexual purity worksheet that I want you to do together and bring with you to our next visit. May God’s Holy Word guide you! If you have any questions about anything in this letter, worksheet or anything else please don’t hesitate to call me anytime. I look forward to seeing you both very soon.
