President's Piece for Peace

This October I will be preaching for a chapel service at the Ft. Wayne Seminary. The text that was given to me for that day is James 4:4-10. I must admit I have spent very little time in the book of James and am ill prepared to preach in front of the scholars of our Church from James. As such I have been studying every commentary I can, including Luther's thoughts, who was not as kind to the Epistle of James as he was to Romans or Galatians. Throughout this study I have become quite fond of this Epistle and gained much admiration for he who may have known Jesus better than any of the Apostles. Peter, James (a different James) and John were Jesus' inner core; James of this Epistle was Jesus' half-brother and grew up with him for a short 30 years. Even though James was skeptical of his older brother at first, after the resurrection he had full comprehension of Jesus as Messiah and pastored the Church in Jerusalem.

The section that receives the most attention from Luther is 2:14-26. Luther worked so hard to confirm for the Church that salvation is a gift from God granted by grace through faith alone that he struggled with James 2 and its language; *"a person is justified by what he does and not by faith alone."* A careful study of the text and the analogy of faith eventually calmed Luther so that he actually preached quite clearly the text of James 2. First he defined the terms and then their application.

Luther does not pit works against faith any more than he does fire against light. Where there is fire there is always light. So also where there is faith in Jesus there is evidence in ones works, or fruits of faith. In fact, Luther contends that faith without fruits therein is really no faith at all. It is more of an intellectual exercise of scholasticism than faith. One may know about Jesus, even the Devil knows about Jesus, but not believe He is the Christ. Faith apprehends who Jesus is and what He has done for us with grace and mercy. Therefore, when James uses the word faith in verses 18-19, 24, 26 he is using it equivalent to historical intellectualism rather than a trust in Christ alone. His example of Abraham and Isaac conveys the heart of his intent in this chapter. He says; *"You see that his (Abraham) faith and his actions were working together."*

Luther is quick to point out that James is not saying that actions or works work together with faith to merit salvation. He is simply saying what was mentioned above, that faith saves and saving faith is evidenced by its fruit. The fruit did not merit anything, they only verify an already existing condition. The lack of fruit would call into question the presence of faith.

This is a good reminder for us as LCMS pastors and church workers. Not that we question this beautiful gospel doctrine. The reminder is helpful for we who are servants committed to the Holy Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions. Being committed to them without the evidence in our ministry is tantamount to not carrying out the ministry entrusted to us. We believe that faith comes by hearing the Word of God. That would mean we preach and teach the Word in its truth and purity in the Sanctuary and classroom. It also means we will take that Word to the homebound, the shut-ins, the hospitals, to the living rooms of those walking a wayward path or those who are absent from Divine Service. We go to them because that is what we believe about the Word; it is *"the power of God for the salvation of all who believe"* (Romans 1:16). It must be heard as it comes forth from our lips for it to do what it promises it will do.

Both James and Luther would agree that the ministry of the Word that does not get to the ears of those who need to hear it, by virtue of the proclaimer refusing to speak it to their ears, calls into question our commitment to the Confessions of the Faith. Ministry is hard work. It always has been and will continue to be. It is hard because the world distains what we do and the sinful nature is constantly warring against the Word of Truth. All of which is more the reason we prepare diligently for Divine Service as well as make the visitations to our members in every need. By such, confession and action work together for the sake of the Church. James and Luther would have it no other way. This too is crucial to the Reformation. Blessed Reformation celebrations to you all. We are dearly blessed in this precious church.

Looking at the Word of God

We will be celebrating the 500th anniversary of the posting of the 95 Theses on October 31, 2017. One of the *Solas* which is attributed to the Reformation is that of *Sola Scriptura*. I would like to share with you a quote of Luther which I ran across in some of my recent reading;

“A similar idea is expressed in Is. 40:8: “The Word of our God will stand forever.” It “stands,” that is, it is steadfast, it is certain, it does not give way, it does not quiver, it does not sink, it does not fall, it does not leave you in the lurch. And where this Word enters the heart in true faith, it fashions the heart like unto itself, it makes it firm, certain, and assured. It becomes buoyed up, rigid, and adamant over and against all temptation, devil, death, and whatever its name may be, that it defiantly and haughtily despises and mocks everything that inclines toward doubt, despair, anger and wrath; for it knows that God’s Word cannot lie to it.”

Such is the power in the pure Word of God.

The Pastor is given the privilege and responsibility to preach and teach that Word of God. Of that Word Luther wrote: *“It is the Word which changes and touches hearts; revelations, however puff people up and make them arrogant... God speaks to us through Scripture and through the man who teaches Scripture. He who hears these is not deceived. But we are to flee from special revelations concerning the faith, for they are satanic impostures.”* The obvious warning is that we must not preach or teach anything but the Word of God itself. For when we teach that Word people will hear about Christ Jesus and what He has done about our greatest need, that of our sin. For Paul said of Jesus; *“But by His doing you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification, and redemption, that, just as it is written, “LET HIM WHO BOASTS, BOAST IN THE LORD” (I Corinthians 1:30-31).*

Luther also had this warning to those who are called to preach God’s Word;

“For He knew well enough that there would be many of them who would indeed boast of His name, calling themselves Christ’s disciples and preachers of the Gospel, but would nonetheless think more of their own ideas, honor, and glory than of the blood and death of Christ. They would not value His grace and unspeakable love and everything He devoted to our salvation so highly as to endanger or surrender their enjoyment, their honor and power, and rid themselves of their own smartness and wisdom. They would be more interested in being considered and commended as learned and wise than in knowing what is becoming of Christ and the pure doctrine of the Gospel.”

Our Synodical slogan for this anniversary celebration reminds us that **“It’s Still All About Jesus!”**

Unfortunately some church bodies have pretty much deserted the Word of God and so the people are left with nothing. Luther says; *“Learn, yea, learn, I say, what a treasure you have in the Word of our Lord Jesus Christ; that there is no other help and aid against the devil, sin, and eternal death than to cling to the Word of Christ, that is, to believe His promise and to make bold to take Him at His word.”* The words of the country western song, *“Looking for Love in All the wrong places,”* could easily be paraphrased today to *“Looking for salvation in all the wrong places,”* in all places other than Christ Jesus, His Word and Sacraments. As to the importance of *Sola Scriptura* Luther adds; *“Is it not true that God’s Word is greater and more important than faith? For God’s Word is not based and built on faith, but faith is built on God’s Word. Besides, faith may waver and change, but God’s Word remains eternally.”* May your Reformation celebration be Christ-centered and flow from His eternal Word.


What's In Your Wallet?

Romans 7:15-25a

An ex-Apple employee, Huxley Dunsany, was given these 11 rules for success when he was hired by the company back in 2004 and has held on to them since. The article this story came from said that the executive, John Brandon, gave these rules to the employees he supervised and they were attached to the back of their employee badge.



What's in your wallet? Or on the back of your ID badge you wear around your neck? No, this isn't an advertisement for Capitol One credit cards. Seriously. What's in your wallet? What are your rules of success? Would any of the above be on your list? If we just think of our wallets or ID badge filled with rules and regulations that affect our professional and personal life it can very easily become a yolk hanging around our neck. Where's the "fun" in teaching or living if we feel like we can't turn left or right without a rule keeping us on the straight and narrow?

It's frustrating trying to keep all those rules. It's tough having these "faith struggles;" however, we're not alone. St. Paul struggled as well. He writes in Romans 7:15-25a (NIV);

¹⁵ I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do. ¹⁶ And if I do what I do not want to do, I agree that the law is good. ¹⁷ As it is, it is no longer I myself who do it, but it is sin living in me. ¹⁸ For I know that good itself does not dwell in me, that is, in my sinful nature. For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. ¹⁹ For I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want to do—this I keep on doing. ²⁰ Now if I do what I do not want to do, it is no longer I who do it, but it is sin living in me that does it. ²¹ So I find this law at work: Although I want to do good, evil is right there with me. ²² For in my inner being I delight in God's law; ²³ but I see another law at work in me, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin at work within me. ²⁴ What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me from this body that is subject to death? ²⁵ Thanks be to God, who delivers me through Jesus Christ our Lord!

If Paul could be frustrated and say "I just don't understand it", we aren't alone in our frustration and inability to understand either. The good news is, however, as we live our life with these "faith struggles", God has given us resources. We are not alone. You see, He gave us His Son, Jesus, who struggled as well. He struggled to be faithful to His Father. He struggled asking that the cup pass, and He would not have to drink of it. He struggled to the point of his sweat becoming like great drops of blood falling to the ground. Yes, He struggled for us and for our salvation. St. Paul realized

he couldn't do anything to be rescued on his own. It was above his ability. There was no self-help course, no wallet large enough, or efforts to try harder that was going to get him out the situation. Did you see Paul's answer to the struggle in vs. 25? "*Thanks be to God, who delivers me through Jesus Christ our Lord!*" Wowsers! Christ is the perfect Resource!

We daily have to fight against the old sinful nature. "*The old Adam was drowned in baptism, but that sucker can swim,*" as Luther once quipped. The old, sinful nature must be drowned daily as we remember our baptism in repentance. By virtue of your baptism you are a saint! Why? Because God said so. He put His name on you, crucified you with His Son, raised you to a new life, clothed you in Christ's righteousness, and washed you clean.

I ask again - what's in your wallet my brothers and sisters in Christ? Remembering that Christ has rescued us from the sin, death, and Satan, and has given us the Gospel in order that we might live out our faith, be assured that your wallet is filled with His unconditional love for you, your students, your co-workers, and all those with whom you come in contact. Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!

As we celebrate and observe the 500th anniversary of the Reformation this month, I ask you to join me in taking a few minutes to write down some success statements that have come to us through the gift of Christ in your life. Perhaps the first one would be "I am a baptized child of God". If you are so inclined, I really encourage you and would be appreciative if you would share your list with me. 



