This is a gathering of the Church to carry on with the work of the Church, which is simplified to these two things: 1) to seek and save the lost; and 2) to feed the found.

# The Unchanging Word of God!

This past Saturday I was working in my yard. The spool retainer on my weed eater broke. I went in the house, took out the phone book and called my hardware store. They said they had some replacement parts. I hopped into my vehicle and drove to the store. They did not have that particular part on hand. Down the road I went to Menards and then finally to Home Depot, all with the same disappointing results.

Today I did what most people seem to be doing, I “ordered the part online.” How we shop has changed. How people “do” many things in life seems to have changed. How people communicate today has changed with all the social media platforms. What people want in a church has changed in this post-Christian culture that we find ourselves living in. Too many churches have become consumer driven instead of being “Christ-centered.” That reflects itself as the church struggles between asking “what do people want in a church”, versus the church knowing “what people need.” How the church approaches those questions will set her priorities. She will either try to be people pleasers or faithful to God and His Word!

When I speak of a post-Christian culture, or you could call it a post-church culture, I mean that the church is no longer a dominant or focal part of the culture and community. People look at the church with a take-it-or-leave-it attitude. It becomes, for many people, something that they think they can turn on or off much like a faucet. The Church makes herself irrelevant when it no longer proclaims Christ Jesus and Him crucified.

How people shop has definitely changed! What never changes is God’s Word and the Church’s need to interact with people, with that Word. The Church will always be relevant when it faithfully proclaims God’s Word. People need Christ Jesus and His Church. People need to hear God’s Law (second use especially, “mirror”) and the Gospel (the blood drenched Christ upon the cross, dying for the sins of the world, and rising for our justification).

That never changes. John wrote: *“If we say that we have no sin, we are deceiving ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we say that we have not sinned, we make Him a liar, and His Word is not in us. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. And the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin.”* (I John 1:8, 10, 9,7c)

The challenge is always, how are we going to engage people with the unchanging Word of God? Dr. David Scaer wrote a book entitled, *What Do You Think of Jesus?* That might be one way to begin to engage your unchurched or de-churched neighbor or co-worker. It focuses the conversation around Jesus and while the way we “do” things changes, the Gospel of Christ Jesus is the “done for you” reality which never changes. *“For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven, And do not return there without watering the earth, And making it bear and sprout, And furnishing seed to the sower and bread to the eater; So shall My word be which goes forth from My mouth; It shall not return to Me empty, Without accomplishing what I desire, And without succeeding in the matter for which I sent it”* (Isaiah 55:10-11).


It's June! The students are gone (unless you operate a day care center as part of your ministry). Books are put away. Bulletins boards have been taken down. Report cards are finished, and grades have become part of the students' permanent records. Desks are shoved to one side of the room so the summer cleaning can take place. End-of-year faculty meetings are over and you've had your year-end interview with your principal to go over goals from the past year and new goals for next year. If you are an administrator, your work is never done! Time to finish end-of-year reports and start planning for next year. Maybe you are sitting in someone else's classroom, enrolled in a class that will keep your teacher certification up to date. Perhaps you're taking a class toward an advanced degree or colloquy.

Have you taken time to sit down on one of Iowa's warm summer days with a cold glass of lemonade and reflect on the past school year? How did your year go? Does the word "weary" come to mind? The dictionary says that weary

means to be "physically or mentally exhausted by hard work, or exertion, strain, feeling fatigued, tired, impatient, or dissatisfied". Kind of sounds like how we feel at the end of a long school year, doesn't it? We can be sure there were times when our colleagues, administrator, Board members, and congregation members had similar feelings of being weary, while trying to do good. Things don't always go smoothly in a Lutheran school. Satan delights in seeing Christians, even Christians in Lutheran schools, go at it with one another.

Weariness comes from a variety of things. One is that we tend to get off track and focus on every tiny detail. We major in the minors, so to speak. Is it really important that all the "I's are dotted" and the "t's are crossed" on an assignment or project? Weariness, as we know, can lead to burn out. After a full day of teaching, there are meetings to go to, papers to correct, and parents to call. Another contributor to weariness is when we try to do everything ourselves and neglect to rely on God to help us through the situation, or underestimate His presence in our teaching situation. How many times do we "think" we don't have the means to get things done the way we would like? If we only had a bigger gym, if the internet connection would be able to keep all of my students and me online, or if I had a copier at my end of the hallway.

In Ephesians, Paul says that the enemy of the church isn't material things (money/computers/a helicopter parent/gossip/faculty divisions, etc). The enemy of the church is spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms, namely the Evil One (Eph. 6:10). Satan is still around today. As you end and reflect on the 2017-2018 school year, it can't be about you trying harder. It can't be about you at all! We can only be enthused – not weary – when we are in Christ. Now is not the time to think poorly on how the year went. Now is the time to thank God for supplying you with spiritual health this year. It was He who fed you through Word



and Sacrament. The Holy Spirit energized you through the means of grace to keep you from becoming weary so that you could strive to meet the goal of being “Jesus with skin on” to your students, colleagues, and fellow members of the body of Christ.

Your summer vacation will fly by and the new school year will be here before you know it. Whether you have finished your first or 35<sup>th</sup> year of teaching, it doesn’t matter. *It’s not about us or our good works.* Rather, it’s all about God’s work in us that He has planned for us to do. Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit we can ensure that our children, our children’s children, and people who need to have Christ in their lives will be able to come to your school and classroom, so they will grow and be nurtured in their relationship with Jesus, our Lord and Savior.

During this time of relaxing and reflection, pray about this, talk about this, and continue to move forward in faith. Strive, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to move forward in faith so that we are able to continue to train ourselves and our kiddos in godliness, for at the proper time we will reap the harvest that God has in store for us, if we do not give up.

## Task Force Discusses Procreation, Fertility

The 2016 LCMS Convention adopted Resolution 3-04, “To Create Task Force for Study of Issues Relating to Procreation, Fertility, and Care for Unborn.” Noting that “Christians are seeking guidance from the church, based on the Holy Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions regarding the use of contraception, in vitro fertilization (IVF), other reproductive technologies, and the use of aborted fetal tissue for medical purposes,” the resolution asked the president of the Synod to appoint a task force of individuals, “respected for their expertise in the fields of medicine, procreative science, theology, ethics and the like to study issues surrounding fertility and procreation.”

The members of the task force include the Rev. Kevin Robson, LCMS Chief Mission Officer; medical doctors Debra Grime and Donna Harrison; clinical laboratory and informatics expert Dr. Andrea Pitkus; ethicists Dr. James Bachmann, the Rev. Dr. Gilbert Meilaender and the Rev. Dr. Kevin Voss; attorney Ann Stillman, esq.; and theologians and pastors the Rev. Dr. Joel Okamoto, the Rev. Prof. John Pless and the Rev. Michael Salemink. Staff support is provided by the Rev. Dr. Joel Lehenbauer and the Rev. Larry Vogel, Commission on Theology and Church Relations Executive Director and Associate Executive Director respectively. Lehenbauer chairs the task force.

The task force met December 8–9, 2017. In its discussions, the members noted the breadth of the issues raised both directly and indirectly by Res. 3-04. Although the items raised all relate to human reproduction and tend toward a consideration of technological “advances,” there are also underlying cultural assumptions and questions that challenge the Christian. The task force agreed that it was important to try to address “foundational matters” relative to these questions and assumptions. For example, the biblical view that parents are blessed with a child as a gift of God today faces a competing view, wherein children are viewed more as a parental reproductive project and an entitlement.

Dr. Lehenbauer notes, “The Church is uniquely equipped to address the human desire to have a child, starting with infant Baptism where the baby is given identity as a child of God.” After addressing such substantive and foundational matters, the task force will discuss some of the moral and ethical questions about human procreation and the reproductive technology that is now in use. It will also seek to “identify actions leading to the production of appropriate LCMS responses to these issues … with the CTCR and/or other appropriate LCMS entities” (Res. 3-04).

Specific topics may include: 1) infertility (IVF), 2) contraception, 3) embryo adoption and 4) genetic therapy (CRISPER/cas9), among others. *Future meetings are scheduled for May and October of this year.*


