## President's Piece for Peace - Maintaining Unity

When reading the epistles of St. Paul it is clear he has a personal connection with the recipients of these letters. His opening remarks are very generous with thanks to God for their fidelity to the Gospel and commitment to the church through struggles and trials. Recently I was driving to an elders meeting that took me south on highway 218. It was a quiet afternoon drive until a vehicle was traveling over 100 miles an hour going north in the southbound

lanes. I would have had no time to react to avoid the vehicle if it were in my lane. I am thankful it wasn't but very shortly after passing me (along with two county patrolmen in chase), another vehicle was in the path of the

oncoming vehicle. It was a fatal collision that seconds earlier, and ten feet closer, could have been me.

With this tragedy came the thought; What was the last thing I said to anyone that day, or that week? Did I bless them with God's grace? Did I wish them well? Did I say anything that revealed the fact I care for them? It is worth giving consideration to isn't it? Whether we depart from others not to see them again, or if it is from morning until evening, departing with the words of St. Paul to the church is the language of personal care and well wishes. Should those be the last words anyone hears from you, they would be sufficient to reflect what we believe and in Whom we believe.

He is our great joy for peace in any day, the days past as well as the days to come.

Whether accidents occur or nature takes it toll, our desire is for the fellowship of the Holy Christian Church to dwell in the courts of the Lord's House forever. Until that time, it is a wonderful privilege to reflect our love for each other and appreciation for fidelity to the Faith and commitment to the church especially when struggles beset us.

Let your parting words with anyone you converse be the blessing of the Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. These are the words with which I bestow upon you the reader of this article.

The Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you always.

Its assets shall be used exclusively for the following: To provide financing and services for the acquisition ofsites; the construction of facilities; the purchase of buildings and equipment; operating expenses; professional church worker education; the residential housing needs of professional church workers; and other purposes approved by its governing board consistent with the ministry and mission of

the Synod under policies approved by the Board of Directors of the Synod.

The role of District Vice President (DVP) acts as a relationship manager, working with LCMS congregations, schools, ministry partners and church workers by building relationships, identifying needs and proposing solutions where LCEF can provide financial and other resources to grow ministry in partnership with the district. This position's geographic territory includes the state of lowa.



#### 140th Anniversary of Trinity Lutheran Church - Cedar Rapids

Trinity Lutheran Church, Cedar Rapids celebrated her 140<sup>th</sup> Anniversary on the weekend of August 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup>, 2024. Trinity was organized in August 1884 by Pastor Philip Studt of Luzerne. On November 24, 1884 classes began at Trinity Lutheran School. On April 12, 1885 Trinity became affiliated with the Lutheran Church- Missouri Synod. Church services were held in German until 1918 when regular services in English began.



Trinity has been involved in the Cedar Rapids community throughout its history, proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Good Friday and Easter services were held in the Strand Theater, several years at the Paramount Theater, and then at the Veterans Memorial Coliseum until the Flood of 2008. The Good Friday service is now held in the school gym with Easter services in the church sanctuary. The flooding of the Cedar River in 2008 devastated much of Cedar Rapids but not the church. Our church family was very involved in the immediate recovery efforts, joining with sister congregations to distribute essential household items to those impacted by flooding.



Trinity has worshiped at its present location since 1957 and recently went through a sanctuary update. The sanctuary was painted and stained, new floors were laid and others were refinished while we worshiped in the school gym.

A full year of celebration included former Pastors of Trinity returning as guest preachers and culminated with the formal Anniversary worship celebration. During the year, former Pas-



tors Doug Francik and Larry Lemke were guest preachers, as well as sons of the congregation Pastor John Mueller from Emmanuel Lutheran in Dwight, Illinois and Pastor Gary Timm from Our Savior in Bettendorf, Iowa. Iowa District East President Saunders was the guest preacher for the formal anniversary weekend and on Sunday morning a celebration meal was served following the service. A congregational picture was taken in the refurbished sanctuary with



#### **IDE LERT Teams Bring Mercy to Iowa Flood Victims**

In June of 2024, several Northwest Iowa communities were devastated by flooding, including several LCMS congregations and their members. Notably, the congregations of Trinity Lutheran Church in Hawarden and Christ the King Lutheran Church in Spencer were significantly damaged, as were the homes of 3 pastors and many members in those congregations. In response, LERT (Lutheran Early Response Team) volunteers from Our Savior Lutheran Church in Bettendorf (top left) and King of Kings Lutheran Church in Cedar Rapids (top right) answered the call to aid our brothers and sisters in Christ in northwest lowa. Both congregations are equipped with disaster response trailers and equipment and have volunteers skilled in flood recovery. In late July, the team from Bettendorf deployed to Spencer and can be seen here restoring the basement of a home (bottom right). Over September 13-15, the King of Kings LERT team deployed to Spencer and worked on 3 different homes installing insulation, drywall, and more (bottom left). Thanks be to God that both Christ the King in Spencer (on 12/15/2024) and Trinity Lutheran in Hawarden (on 9/1/2024) are back in their facilities and have now been able to resume worship services!









## **Congregations & LWML**

- 1. The staff at Trinity Lutheran School began the 2024 academic year, with new teacher Hope Muehler (Concordia University Chicago) being installed and commissioned. Also honored was Mary Becker for the 50 year anniversary of her commissioning.
- 2. The Sunday School children at Trinity Lutheran Church, Conroy planted a tree at church to grow as does their love for Jesus Christ over the summer of 2024.
- 3. Community Lutheran School in Readlyn supported The Luke 2 Project by walking in the Readlyn Lighted Christmas Parade on Saturday, November 30, 2024! Every Friday in December the staff, students, and families were encouraged wear their Luke 2 shirts to school and out in the community sharing the Christmas story of our Savior's birth!

The congregation wanted to put the best foot forward for their current a pastor and his family, in addition to considering the potential need to extend a Divine Call for a new pastor someday.
