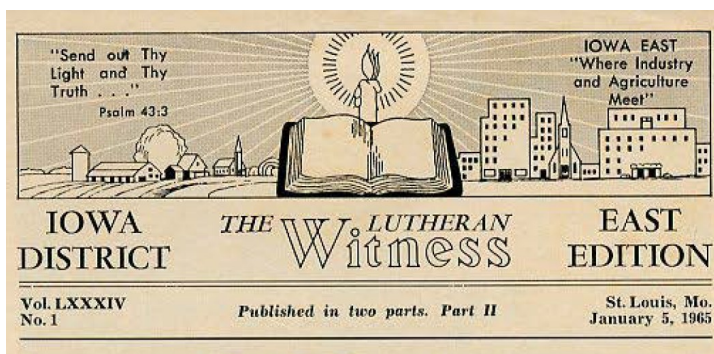

Information for Congregation Historians

Due to the faithfulness of IDE Archivists in years gone by, the news shared with congregations via the *Lutheran Witness* (District specific) *Editions* were either gathered and bound into book volumes, or filed in manila folders and stored in archival gray boxes. The documents are full of information about congregation events, district & circuit events, obituaries of church workers, and much more. However, since hardly anyone knows about these documents, no one has been rushing to the IDE Archives to search for information which might be added to a congregation's preparation for a congregation history celebration.



This is to inform you that what has been resting in storage has now come out of hiding. The pages of each ***Lutheran Witness-IDE Edition***—from 1935 to

1988—have been scanned, converted to PDF files, and made so that a person can actually search for the location of a specific word. For the congregation historian, this means you can type in the name of your congregation, or a pastor who once served there, and command the search function to find that name anywhere from 1935-1988.

Now I am aware that many folks might be experts at surfing the internet. However, I am going to back up and give a detailed explanation as to how you can make use of these “searchable” documents. You can also click on or scan the QR code to the right with your smartdevice camera to open the documents on your smartphone or tablet.

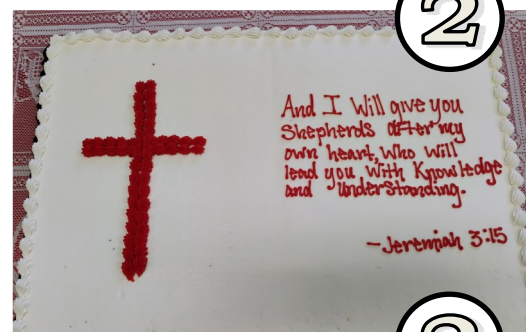
01. Browse the internet by typing in [LCMSIDE.ORG]
02. Top of LCMS IDE Home-page move mouse pointer over to [Resources]
03. Scroll down to and click on [IDE Library & Archives]
04. Next click on [History and Archives]
05. Next click on [Lutheran Witness – Iowa East Edition]
06. Now you can download all PDFs from 1935-1988, or just the years you are interested in]
07. Now find what you downloaded in the place where your internet downloads are sent.
08. Double click on the PDF you want to search and read.
09. Go to the place where your computer allows you to “find” words within the PDF and click it. For me, that is a symbol in the upper right that looks like a magnifying glass.
10. A box opens and might be blinking as to where you can type the word you want to have “searched”.
11. Click the “Next Result” (may look like this -Ú-) and wait for next place your selected word shows up in the document.

42nd Convention of Iowa District East—LCMS

The 42nd Convention of the Iowa District East – LCMS took place June 27-28, 2025 at the Radisson Hotel - Cedar Rapids. Rev. Dr. Brian Saunders (Cedar Rapids) was elected on the first ballot to his 6th term as District President, with Rev. W. Max Mons, S.T.M. (Iowa City) being reelected to 1st Vice-President and Rev. Stephen Preus, S.T.M. (Vinton) elected as 2nd Vice-President, both on the first ballot. The host congregation was St. Paul's Lutheran Church Marion with Pastor Alan Kornacki serving as Convention Chaplain. Mr. Riley Sindt served as musician.

Rev. Dr. Joel Biermann of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis was the Convention Essayist, who expounded on the theme of Psalm 119:105 - The Authority of the Word: The Word Walks Us Through Life. LCMS 6th Vice-President Rev. Dr. John Wohlrabe was the synod representative, and Rev. Dr. Matthew C. Harrison, President of the LCMS was in attendance Saturday of the convention to deliver his report and lead a Synod question-and-answer time.



In other elections news, all Board of Directors incumbents were reelected. Rev. Peter Hoft (Eldridge) was elected as Secretary and Mr. Zach Rowley (Cedar Rapids) was elected as Treasurer. Mr. Lucas Tanney (Waterloo) was elected as the commissioned minister, while Mr. Samuel Kleiss (Dike) was elected as a layman to the IDE Board of Directors. Mr. Kleiss was first appointed to the Board of Directors following the passing of IDE Board Member Chris Balvanz in 2023.



For the Constitutional Review Committee, Rev. Jesse Burns (Ventura) was elected as an ordained member. For the 2028 Nominating Committee, Rev. Alex Post (Marshalltown) and Rev. Nathan Wille (Clinton) were elected as ordained members, Mr. Andy Armbrecht (Williamsburg) was elected as a commissioned member, and Mr. Jeff Elbert (Waterloo) and Mr. Paul Moritz (Atkins) were elected as

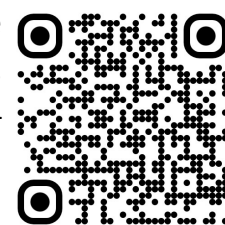
Camp Io-Dis-E-Ca - Summer Camp 2025: With Open Arms

Jan Doellinger Receives Master Educator Award

Jan Doellinger, Assistant to the President - Schools, was this year's recipient of Concordia University Nebraska's Master Educator Award, which is presented to teachers, Directors of Christian Education, school administrators, or deaconesses who have distinguished themselves through prolonged superior service in Lutheran educational ministry. In her district role, she represents the president at all schools and preschools, serves as a resource to all schools and early childhood centers in the district, provides call lists and offers resources and support to new school starts. She also partners with others to plan and present yearly teacher's conferences, early childhood conferences, principal's conferences, and board trainings.

Doellinger previously served as teacher and then principal at Central Lutheran School in Newhall, Iowa, as middle school principal at Faith Lutheran Middle School & High School in Las Vegas, as teacher, assistant principal and principal of Trinity Lutheran School in Davenport, Iowa, and as teacher at St. Paul's Lutheran School, North Tonawanda, New York. She said her time at Concordia Nebraska prepared her well for her work.

"This award isn't about me. It's about how God has used me to do His work. The Scripture passage that comes to mind is Colossians 3:15-17 "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful. Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts. And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him." I'm just one of thousands of Lutheran school teachers past, present and future, who do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus every day because it's not about us," she said. "It's about how Christ uses each one of us to tell the story of Jesus by what we think, say, and do with all the people in our ministry that we come in contact. No, I don't deserve this honor, but I can honor our Lord by recognizing the fact that He is the One who is being honored, and I am His vessel. To Him be the glory!"

Active in her church, Doellinger has volunteered as an usher, handbell choir director, children and adult choir director and educational consultant. In addition to her current role with Iowa District East, she has served on the IDE Board of Directors, the IDE Schools Committee, and the IDE Parish Education Committee. She is also an ex-officio member of the Christ Lutheran High School board of directors. She is married to Rev. Jerry Doellinger and has two stepchildren, Chad and Chris Doellinger, and four grandchildren. Together, Jerry and Jan started the Pastor Jerry and Jan Doellinger Endowment Fund for Student Loan Relief for workers in Iowa District East to help called workers reduce their student debt.

Camp Io-Dis-E-Ca Launching Expanded Horse Programming



Camp Io-Dis-E-Ca soft-launched a new horse lesson and weekend trail ride program in the fall of 2025, with plans for a more year-round slate of horse program offerings in 2026. Mr. Jon Temme, who has been on Camp's summer staff since 2022 and has been a program intern for 2025, will be joining the Camp's staff full-time in 2026. He is a recent graduate of William Woods University in Fulton, Missouri with a degree in Equine Administration. He is also a graduate of the Oklahoma Horse Shoeing School and a certified riding instructor with the Certified Horsemanship Association. Jon has led Camp's horse program for the past 4 summers, and has also assisted seasonally with many retreats and family groups.

In the fall of 2025, weekend trail rides were available for two-hour time slots on Saturdays and Sundays to everyone ages 5 & up, and horse lessons were offered as an after-school program for youth, grades 4-12. Lessons took place once a week and varied in length based on riding experience levels. In 2026, riding lessons and weekend trail rides will start up in the spring season. They will pause for summer horse camp and then resume in the fall. Camp is happy to accept and teach riders of any experience level.

Camp has already begun making several improvements to the horse facilities and arena, with many more to come. This fall they replaced all of the fencing inside the area and are revitalizing the tack shed and restrooms. 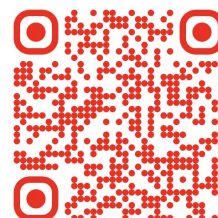

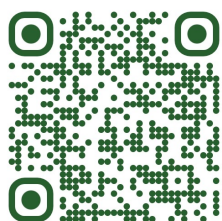

5. LERT (Lutheran Early Response Team) volunteers from Iowa District East and St. Paul Lutheran Church in Mt. Vernon, IA spent 5 days cleaning up Camp Lutherhoma in Tahlequah, OK October 13-17. The Camp was devastated by a tornado in the middle of summer camp, needing to shut down two sessions. In October, 25 LERT volunteers from across the country came to clear out much of the tree damage and open trails up across the camp. LERT volunteers also deployed this year to assist after the tornado at Concordia Seminary in St. Louis May 17-18 and also to Concordia University Nebraska and Seward in August after a severe storm damaged the campus and town. Some new volunteers were trained in Basic LERT and also received a LERT chainsaw certification in 2025.

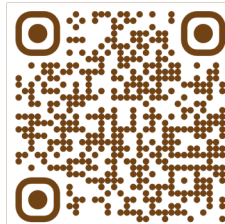
Campus Ministry, Education Workshop, and PALS

1. Theologian in Residence took place at St. Paul's Lutheran Chapel and University Center in Iowa City over March 28-30 with campus ministry groups from Iowa State, UNI, and Iowa. Rev. 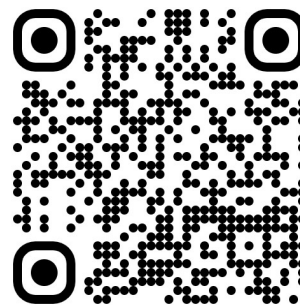
